

In assemblies we share time together to reflect on a variety of issues. All themes for assemblies are reflected in the themes for the week, which are also discussed in tutor groups. Themes for every week in the academic year are listed in the Student Planner.

Every theme shared in assembly helps pupils to understand and realise more fully:

- The aims of the school
- How to be a good citizen
- The difference between right and wrong

Assemblies provide an opportunity to give each year group the opportunity to reflect on spiritual, moral and social issues. When considering the views of people of different faiths our emphasis is on issues affecting Christians. We also celebrate Christian festivals and often mention the festivals and special occasions of other faiths. We <u>make</u> reference to some Christian festivals and often mention the festivals and special occasions of other faiths.

Whenever we can we celebrate the successes of individuals within our school community, these are most usually students and teams. Students are encouraged to participate whenever appropriate, eg providing music, presenting drama sketches, showing examples of work or even running the assembly as a tutor group. Each assembly finishes with an opportunity to pray or for personal reflection.

These themes and others are also <u>often</u> discussed and developed in curriculum time during Philosophy Personal Development (PPD) which is a core subject for all year groups.

Assemblies are generally led by the Leadership Team and Progress Leaders but other key staff across the school and visitors also contribute.
