Eggar's School Uniform Requirements





Students are required to wear our school uniform which engenders a strong sense of belonging and identity. The correct uniform must be worn in school, at school events and activities, and on the way to and from school as part of The Eggar's Way.

Students who do not have the correct full uniform should bring a note from home explaining the reason which needs to be given to their Form Tutor during AM registration. If the matter cannot be corrected by the loan of an item from school or the item being brought from home, the student may be kept out of circulation. Repeated breaches of the school policy may result in consequences being applied as per our behaviour policy. This can include, but is not limited to, a Tier One, Two or Three consequence, uniform report, or being kept out of circulation until the uniform is corrected.

Students who are repeatedly unable to meet our expectations may be placed on Uniform Report. Tutors will work in partnership with parents/carers to monitor the progress made on a Report Card and provide support as required to enable the student to meet the school's standards.

Our judgement is final in all issues relating to uniform.

Jewellery

Jewellery is limited to one set of small stud earrings. All other piercings must be removed, regardless of how recently they were done. We advise students to have any new piercings at the start of the summer holidays to allow for healing.

Students not meeting these expectations may be kept out of circulation until the issue is resolved or a date is agreed with parents/carers. Repeated breaches will result in contact home and Uniform Consequences as outlined above.

Skirt Length

Skirts worn as part of the school uniform are expected to be of a smart and professional length, sitting just above the knee. If a student's skirt does not meet this expectation, we will ask that parents or carers either replace it with a skirt of the correct length or that the student begins wearing tailored trousers instead. We recognise that students may remain the same waist size while growing taller, which can affect the fit of uniform over time. For this reason, we advise families to consider purchasing skirts that fall below the knee at the time of purchase to allow for growth and ensure longevity.


Cultural and Religious Considerations

At Eggar's, we value and respect the cultural and religious diversity of our school community. We understand that some students may wear specific jewellery or adopt particular hairstyles or hair colours as part of their cultural or religious identity. If this applies to your child, we ask that you contact the school in advance so we can make reasonable adjustments.

Makeup

Makeup, if worn, should be subtle and natural in appearance. Students are not permitted to wear excessive makeup, including heavy foundation, bold eye makeup, or strong contouring. False eyelashes, acrylic nails, nail varnish, or any other artificial enhancements are not allowed and will need to be removed. Repeated breaches will result in contact home and Uniform Consequences as outlined above.

Please ensure that all uniform, PE kits and bags are clearly named.

PE Kit Expectations

If a student is unable to participate in a PE lesson due to injury, illness, or another valid reason, they may still be expected to change into their PE kit and support the lesson in a non-active role, where appropriate. This allows the student to remain involved in the learning and maintain high expectations. Students who forget their PE kit will be issued a **Tier 1 consequence**. Please refer to the Behaviour Policy for further details on the length and nature of this consequence.

Forgotten/Lost or Uniform that is unfit for purpose

We ask that parents and guardians monitor their child's uniform throughout the school year to ensure it remains in good condition and meets our uniform expectations. However, we understand that occasionally items may be forgotten, lost, or become unfit for purpose. In such cases, it is the student's responsibility to report to Student Services at the start of the school day to borrow replacement uniform or receive a uniform pass.

Students should not wait to be challenged by staff — proactive responsibility is expected. Repeated incidents may result in follow-up contact home to discuss the issue and offer appropriate support if needed.

For any uniform-related matters, parents or carers are encouraged to notify the school in advance via enquiries@eggars.hants.sch.uk or the child's tutor, who should always be the first point of contact. Where there are financial pressures impacting on uniform, we encourage families to make contact with the Heads of School or the tutor so that support can be provided.
